2018 NOBLES COUNTY OUTSTANDING CONSERVATIONISTS

Brian and Michelle Ling were named the 2018 Nobles County Outstanding Conservationists.

The Lings farm in Bigelow Township, but don't own any of the land they farm. Brian is the third-generation Ling to farm the land and completes most of the work himself with the help of his wife, Michelle.

Nearly 35 years ago Brian and his dad, Tom, decided to start implementing no-till practices. Within a few years, all of the land the Ling duo farmed had been converted to no-till. Lately, the Lings have been working on adding cover crops into the mix.

The Lings also have a few sediment basins in place that have outlasted their expected lifespan. Since converting to cover crops and no-till, soil loss hasn't been a huge issue.

The Lings were recognized during the Minnesota Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts' annual meeting December 9th–11th, 2018. Congratulations Brian and Michelle!

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE REMINDERS

- ⇒ Land Use Permits—Required any time a structure, permanent or portable, are constructed or moved in/on property located within Nobles County to ensure required setbacks from property lines, roads, floodplains, etc. are met. Please contact Nobles County ENVIS at 507-295-5322 to acquire necessary permits prior to construction.
- ⇒ Transferring Property—As of October 1, 2018 Split Authorization Forms are required to be included with recording documents when transferring property that involves splitting parcels. Early submission of proposed legal descriptions will help expedite the process and ensure all necessary structure setbacks are met. If you are considering splitting parcels, contact Nobles County Planning and Zoning at 507-295-53-22 for more information.
- ⇒ Feedlot Licenses—Nobles County Feedlot Licenses must be updated any time an existing feedlot expands, closes or changes ownership. A new feedlot license must be obtained when construction a new feedlot or re-populating a feedlot that has not had livestock in the past four years. Contact Mitchell Hartwig, Nobles County Feedlot Officer at 507-295-5322 with any questions regarding Nobles County Feedlot Rules.

INFORMATION REGARDING WINDBREAKS AND SHELTERBELTS

Tired of drifting snow? A well planned and maintained windbreak can save you money and time by reducing the amount of blowing snow and wind speed. Along with saving money, windbreaks can add value to your property will giving animals a place to take cover in the winter. Tree and shrub plantings for wildlife are a great way to help wildlife survive the harsh Minnesota winters.

Many tree planting projects may be eligible for financial assistance through some federal and local programs. The federal program, Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP) has money for trees if the practice meets specifications to qualify for assistance. Prices for EQIP are based on the program, tree species and tree density. The local programs are provided by Nobles SWCD and the Kanaranzi-Little Rock Watershed District. Payments up to \$1,000 are available for trees planted to meet specifications and standards. The SWCD staff will help with the design and planting of your project to meet the programs requirements.

NATIVE SEED AND NO-TILL DRILL

- The Nobles SWCD can provide access to Native Grass Seed for CRP and Wildlife plantings as well as seed for waterways and other erosion control practices.
- Seed can be delivered within a week.
- Three types of no-till drills are available for rent. The Dew Drop Drill is used behind a small tractor or ATV. The two Great Plains Drills are for use behind a tractor.
- Prices are subject to change
- Payment is required in full before the seed will be ordered.
- A drill rental agreement must be signed before the drill is used.

HOW OFTEN SHOULD YOU HAVE YOUR SEPTIC TANK PUMPED?

Your septic tank should be cleaned (maintained), by a licensed SSTS Maintainer, approximately every three years with the exact frequency depending on levels of use. The licensed maintainer that you choose will inspect your tank to determine if it needs to be pumped. If pumping is required, they will then remove all of the scum and sludge that has accumulated in your tank. The cleaning of your tank must be performed through the 24-inch tank maintenance hole rather than through one of the 4-inch inspection pipes. As a homeowner, you should make certain that this is the case. Failure to utilize the larger and more centrally located maintenance hole will result in your tank being only partially emptied. This will increase the chances of the remaining solids floating out of your tank as it begins to refill, and finding their way into your soil treatment system where they can damage and shorten the life of your drain field.

MISSOURI RIVER BASIN ONE WATERSHED, ONE PLAN

The Missouri River One Watershed, One Plan Planning Group has completed the Missouri River One Watershed, One Plan (1W1P) document. Currently, the plan is in the 60-day review window. Comments should be submitted on this plan by February 25, 2019 to Dan Livdahl (Okabena-Ocheda Watershed District) and Douglas Goodrich (BWSR Board Conservationist).

CONSERVATION RESERVE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (CREP)

What is CREP?

- CREP is a voluntary conservation program that combines federal and state programs across prioritized portions of Minnesota.
- CREP combines the popular Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) with a perpetual Reinvest in MN (RIM) easement. Successful landowners who enroll would receive an annual payment from CRP for 14-15 years along with an up-front payment from the RIM program.
- Lands enrolled in CREP are restored and enhanced for conservation benefits, and remain in private ownership.

What is Eligible?

- Lands need a cropping history in order to be eligible.
- Existing CRP lands that are in the last year of their contract are eligible to be enrolled.
- The priorities for CREP are to add buffers to our lakes, rivers, streams, or ditches and to restore wetland areas.
